

WHAT IS CASH?

Cash is not only currency. There are other items that are considered cash (notes and coins in any currency, bankers' drafts, cheques of any kind, including travellers' cheques).

WHY SHOULD I DECLARE CASH?

The obligation to declare cash on entering or leaving the country is part of the strategic commitment of the Republic of Macedonia to combat money laundering and to counter the financing of terrorism.

WHAT IF I DON'T DECLARE?

The cash will be detained or seized. National legislation sets penalties applicable in case of not declaring or falsely declaring moving from 1,500 – 3000 Euros for natural persons and 6,000-10,000 Euros for legal entities, equivalent amount in Denars. This can include prison sentences for cases related to money laundering or terrorism financing.

WHAT ARE THE RULES?

ENTRY INTO MACEDONIA

The limit for bringing in cash is 10,000 Euros. In case you are bringing effective foreign currency over 10,000 Euros you must declare it to the customs authorities.

EXIT FROM THE COUNTRY

If leaving Macedonia, residents must declare every amount exceeding 2,000 Euros and 120,000 Denars per person and present a certificate from an authorized bank or exchange office.

Taking out effective foreign currency exceeding 10,000 Euros and 120,000 Denars is prohibited.

Non-residents may freely take out up to 10,000 Euros of effective foreign currencies and up to 120,000 Denars per person. In case of taking out over 10,000 euros, passengers are obliged to present the certificate where the amount brought in was registered by the customs authorities upon entry in the country.

WHAT ARE RESIDENTS AND NON-RESIDENTS?

RESIDENT is any natural person with permanent residence in the Republic of Macedonia and person with temporary stay abroad holders of a valid document for stay or work, natural person with temporary resident permit in the Republic of Macedonia, legal entity registered in the Republic of Macedonia and their representative offices abroad, foreign companies' subsidiaries, registered in the Republic of Macedonia, subsidiary of a foreign bank and diplomatic and consular offices of the Republic of Macedonia abroad.

NON-RESIDENT – Every other legal and natural entity not having the status of resident.

ENTRY IN MACEDONIA

EXIT FROM MACEDONIA

From 2,000 to 10,000 EUR – must be declared to Customs and a certificate from an authorized bank or exchange office must be presented	over 10,000 EUR – must be declared to Customs and the Certificate where that amount was registered upon entry in Macedonia must be presented.
Over 10,000 EUR and 120,000 Denars - prohibited	over 120,000 Denars - prohibited
